Vocabulary

Accident	An event that happens unexpectedly without deliberate cause.
Consequence	The result of your actions .
Danger	The possibility of suffering harm or injury.
Risk Taker	A person who takes risks.
Stranger	A person you do not know
Trusted adult	A familiar adult you can turn to for help and support.
Uniform	Distinctive clothing worn by members of a group e.g. school or important people in the community e.g. police officer
