What I should already know:

- Keeping safe is about preventing danger.
- Police officers, teachers, family members and trusted adults are examples of people who can keep you safe .
- Helping others can sometimes bring great risk.
- A one year old taking their first steps is a n example of a healthy risk.



By the end of this unit:

- Recognise that their actions have consequences
- Know how to keep yourself safe in risky situations
- Anticipate consequence and calculate risk
- Recognise that some actions have greater consequences than others
- Make judgements about new situations or new activities and respond accordingly
- Understand that sometimes we have to try things in order to learn
- Realise that risk taking can be good and might help others

Vocabulary

Accident	An event that happens unexpectedly without deliberate cause.
Anticipate	Expect or predict something will happen.
Consequence	The result of your actions .
Precautions	A measure taken in advance to avoid something dangerous happening.
Predict	When you say something will happen in the future.
Preventing	Stop something from happening.
Risk assessment	Identifying hazards and risk factors that have the potential to cause harm in an activity.
Timeline	A representation of time that is clearly marked with important events.
