Key Facts at the end of the unit:

- Personal details belong to me—they are my identity.

- The police protect the public from crime.

Vocabulary

Address	The place where you live (usually has a number, name of street and postcode).
Adult	A person older than 19 years old.
Belongings	Things that are owned by a person; possessions.
Crime	A crime occurs when somebody breaks the law.
Emergency	A unexpected situation that requires help/ immediate action e.g. from the fire brigade etc.
Personal details	Information about you and only you.
Protect	To defend or keep safe; shield from danger.
Safe	Providing protection from harm.
Unsafe	Exposed to danger
