There are many times for us as teachers when we feel like pulling our hair out (like many of you probably did at some point over the last 17 weeks) and we don't always get everything right but I truly believe that being a teacher is the best job ever and we are the lucky ones! Over the last 17 weeks, you have embraced your roles as co-teachers in

addition to protecting, nourishing, supporting and entertaining your children during a time of such uncertainty, fear and national crisis. I know that you will also join me in saying a very big thank you to all the staff who work at St Michael's. Before the last few months happened, I always knew that I was so lucky to be the Headteacher of this school and to work with such a wonderful group of people who are so dedicated and committed to our school community. When we were asked to close our doors on the 20th March, the staff immediately went into autopilot. They ensured this abrupt end to the school year was carried out calmly with your children so as not to cause alarm or distress. By the Monday morning they were all immediately engaged in home learning and SEESAW became the 'new way' and the teachers moved

their classrooms into your homes! They (with you) delivered activities that were educational and interesting. When parents needed help or support, they offered this, either through a message, a phone call or a home visit. When some parents struggled with the technology, the teachers did not give up and offered home learning packs and the TAs were amazing and delivered them. This was all to make sure no child was disadvantaged. The staff did this whilst also working in school with key worker and vulnerable children and in more recent weeks with specific year groups. They have given up their holidays and bank holidays and never once complained. They have been amazing throughout this period and have kept me going with their resilience, positivity, generosity and good humour! Every one of them......teachers, TAs, Mr Henry, the cleaners, the office staff, the kitchen staff without exception have pulled together for the greater good of everyone. They have ensured that all of our children can continue to learn, that our school is a safe place to teach, that parents have been supported and our vulnerable children have been protected. I will never, ever forget this period of time and one of my overwhelming memories will be of how as a school community we have worked together..... what we have truly learnt is that TOGETHER WE ARE STRONGER!


