Our Christmas Fayre will be on Friday 25th November.


We will be holding 4 non uniform days leading up to the Fayre and will ask for donations in exchange. These will be –

respond to the question 'Do you agree that Gods world is good?'


When back in the classroom, they recorded their observations and
