The Knife Angel Monument Tour – Wirral July 2022

The 'Wirral Knife Angel Project', will be located at the Grand Entrance of Birkenhead Park during July 2022. The monument is made of seized knives and symbolises turning away from

knife crime and violence and promotes positive choices for young people. It is 27 feet high and weighs 3.5 tonnes. It is bolted on to a concrete platform that weighs 1 tonne.

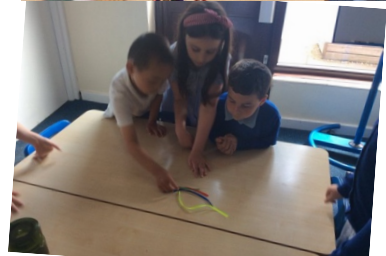

After discovering a large amount of rubbish littered throughout our school grounds, Eco Club had to take action! They removed 6 bags of



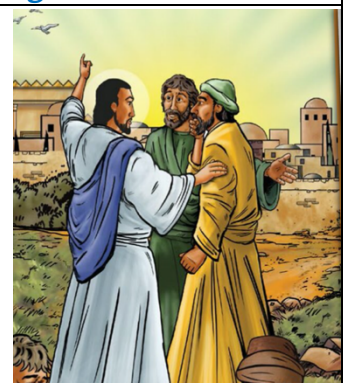
rubbish, protecting the safety of our wildlife and restoring the beauty of our school grounds
