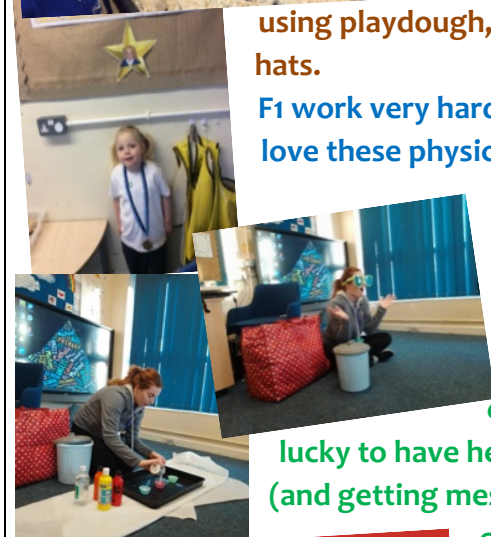


## We have seen lots of fantastic learning going on in school again this week...

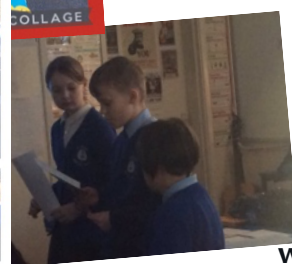
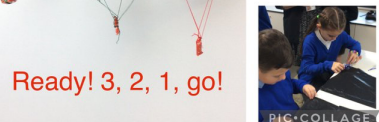
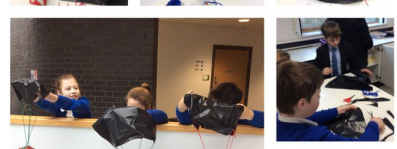
After school STEM club explored capillary action using water absorption to open a paper flower.
