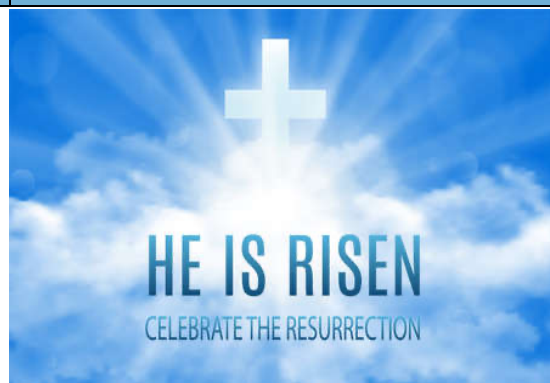




And just like that, another term is done! It's been another non-stop week in school with

They also had a great time making Easter chick cupcakes. Foundation 2 started to explore and reflect upon the Easter story. They used small world resources to re-enact the story.

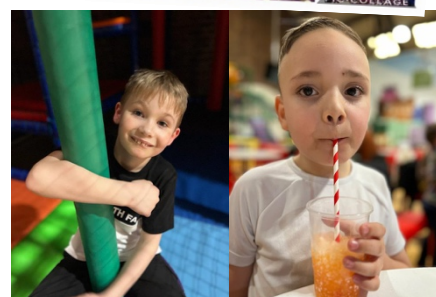


They created their own palms and waved them as they sang 'Sing Hosanna'.
