trying even when it's tricky. Lots of children decided to 'be like Zog' this week and try their hardest to learn new skills.



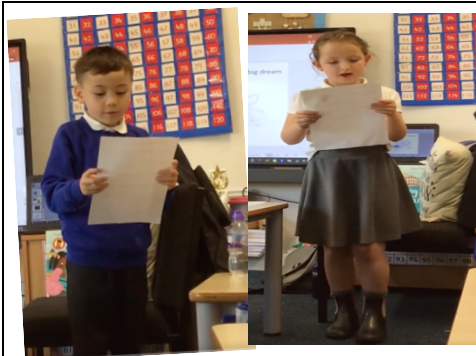

On Wednesday, Year 6 attended an

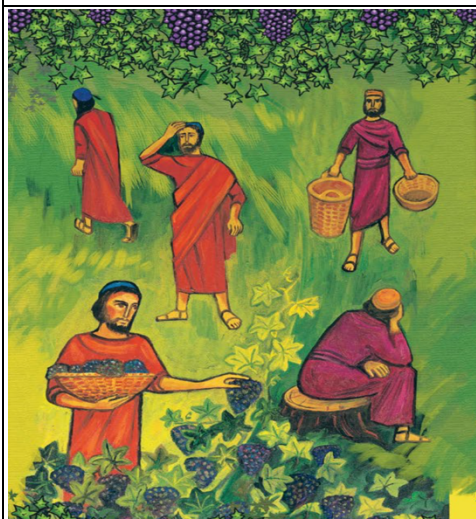

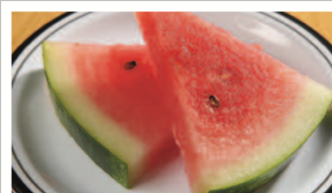
