Human Rights	Human Rights are rights you have simply because you are human.
Justice	The giving out of something that is deserved—reward or punishment.
Polite	Having or showing behaviour that is respect- ful and considerate of other people
Respectful	An act of giving attention or showing care
Rules	A set list of things we must follow for something to run smoothly.
