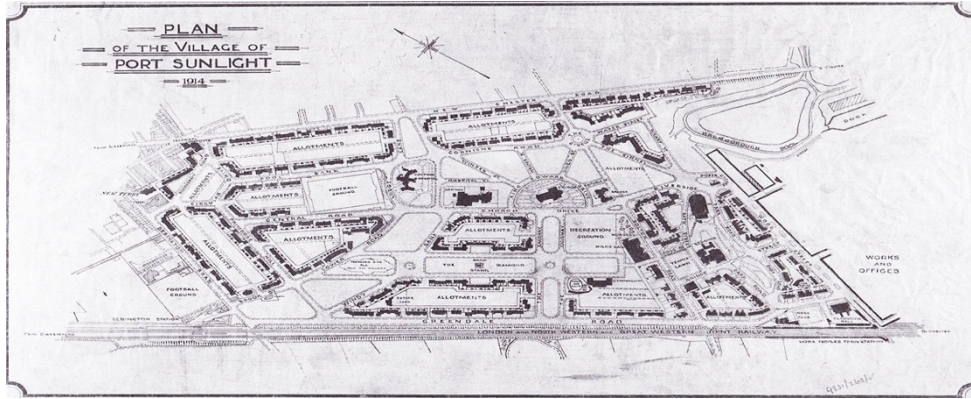

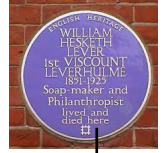

National Curriculum:

Vocabulary

Chronological Order	The arrangement of things following one after another in time.
Compare/ Contrast	Note what is similar and different about two or more things
Contrast	Being strikingly different from something.
Local	Relating to a particular area or one's neighbourhood.
National	Relating to or characteristic of a nation; common to a whole nation.
Philanthropist	A person who gives money or gifts to charities or helps needy people.
Significant/ Significance	A person or event can be significant for good or bad reasons. It is someone that did something important that changed people's lives at the time or after. It is an event that led to important changes in an aspect of life either at the time or in the future.

Key Facts at the end of this Unit:

Lord Lever Hulme was a philanthropist – he gave to charities and the less privileged.	Lord Leverhulme was a factory owner who made soap.
Lord Leverhulme built a village for his workers in 1888.	Lord Lever Hulme built Port Sunlight Village in Wirral to improve living conditions for his employees.
Port Sunlight was built during Victorian times.
