Vocabulary	
Bust	A sculpture of a person's head, shoulders and chest
Carve	Cut in to a hard material in order to produce an object, design or inscription
Classical art	One of the four periods of art of ancient Greece, usually dated from about 1000BC
Engrave	Cut or carve a design on the surface of a hard object
Praxiteles	Ancient Greek sculptor who was one of the most famous and greatest sculptors of ancient Greece. His work was during the Late Classical Period and Hellenistic Period of Greek art.
Sculpting	Create or represent something by carving
Sculpture	The art of making a 3D form by carving
Statue	A carved figure of a person or animal.

## **Key information**

Ancient Greek sculptures are important to us today because they depict the people who lived there and show us what their life was like.

Most sculptures in Ancient Greece were made out of marble or bronze.

Praxiteles was one of the most famous and greatest sculptors of ancient Greece. His work was during the Late Classical Period and Hellenistic Period of Greek art.
