Key Facts at the end of the unit:

- Basic stages of emotional development are: Infant or baby (Birth— 2years old), Toddler or preschool age (2-5 years old), School age (6-12 years old), Adolescent or teenager (13-18 years old).
- Social and emotional changes hat might present themselves within friendships include: feeling embarrassed, need for privacy, mood swings without warming, divided loyalty may occur between self, friends and parents, production of hormones trigger sexual desires, arousal and urge, evolving a set of moral codes, seeking independence, risk taking behaviour.
- Physical changes during puberty in girls—breasts develop, hips broaden, menstruation begins, uterus enlarges, vaginal lining thickens, first menstruation occurs approximately 12 months after breasts have begun to develop, usually start to grow hair on underarm, pubic area and legs.
- Physical changes in boys—testosterone increases in the blood stream, muscles and bones develop, voice deepens, waist thickens, shoulders broaden, wet dreams and erections, penis and scrotum enlarge, hair can grow on face, chest, back, underarms and pubic area, production of sperm and discharge of seminal fluid during ejaculation, Adam's apple enlarges.
