

Four points of a compass —

North, South, East and West.

Belfast is the capital of Northern Ireland.

Edinburgh is the capital of Scotland.

Atlas	Book of maps.		
Capital City	The city where the Government sits. London is the capital city of England.		
Compass Point	Any of the main points of a compass, for example, North, South, East and West.		
Country	A nation with its own government.		
England	A country in the United Kingdom.		
Flag	A piece of cloth that can be attached to a pole and which is used as a symbol of a particular country.		
Great Britain	An island that is made up of England, Scotland and Wales.		
Island	A piece of land that is completely surrounded by water.		
Sea	A large area of salty water that is part of an ocean.		
Seasons	One of four periods of the year which have different weather and hours of sunlight.		
Surrounded	To be present all around.		
United Kingdom	The UK is made up of four countries—England, Scotland, Wales and Northern Ireland.		
World	The earth and all the people, places and things on it.
