


Leonardo Da Vinci self portrait

<u>Vocabulary</u>	
Charcoal	Black crumbly drawing material made from carbon and often used for sketching and under-drawing fro paintings
Complimentary colours	Colours which are close together on the colour wheel: red, yellow, orange; blue, purple, red; blue yellow, green
Contrasting colours	Colours which are opposite on the colour wheel: red and green; blue and orange; yellow and purple.
Leonardo Da Vinci (1452-1519)	An Italian artist of the Renaissance whose interests included, invention, drawing, painting, sculpture, architecture, science, music, mathematics, engineering, literature, anatomy, geology, astronomy, botany, palaeontology and cartography. Famous paintings include the Mona Lisa and The Last Supper
Materials	Variety of paper, fabric, ribbons, etc used to create the art work
Medium/media	The materials used to create the art work.
Paper	Material on which we write or draw.
Technique	The way of carrying out a particular task, especially in artistic work
