This term we will be developing our learning in the following areas:


### Personal, Social & Emotional Development.

- Learning to think about our feelings and how we can help our friends feel happy.
- Learning to share, take turns and listen carefully.
- Developing our play with our friends - cooperating and planning together.
- Following our class rules and behaving kindly and helpfully towards others.
- Learning about healthy eating.



### Physical Development

- Learning about our bodies, the things we can do and the importance of exercise.
- Playing running and spatial awareness games.
- Using a variety of large and small equipment: throwing and catching, kicking, bikes and scooters, benches.
- Creating and using obstacle courses in our outdoor area to develop balance and body control.
- Developing pencil control using a variety of drawing and painting materials in different areas.
- Developing scissor control – cutting out pictures and collage materials in the workshop.



### Communication, Language & Literacy


- Sharing and learning a range of stories and using drama to create simple performances for our friends and teachers.
- Sharing lots of books, developing our language and imagination and beginning to retell and make up stories.
- Talking to our friends and teachers about our ideas and listening to our friends.
- Learning and performing rhymes and thinking about rhyming words.
- Daily phonic activities which explore different sounds.


### Mathematical Development.

- Learning and performing number rhymes and action rhymes.
- Reciting numbers to 10 or 20 and learning to count up to 5 or 10 in a range of situations.
- Recognise and begin to record numbers to 10
- Learning to recognise shapes: circle, square, triangle, rectangle, star, diamond and use them to make models and pictures.
- Talking about and comparing size: bigger, biggest, smaller, smallest, longer, shorter, taller
- Sorting lots of different objects, comparing, ordering and describing them.
- Using different sized containers in the water and the sand trays to think about full, empty, more, less, the same.



### Understanding The World.

- Exploring our school environment and questioning and describing what we observe.
- Hunting for minibeasts and creating simple habitats for them to live in.
- Growing plants from seed.
- Using iPads to play interactive games and explore different apps and using cameras to take photographs.
- Programing a Bee-Bot to move in different directions.



### Expressive Arts & Design

- Joining in with songs and rhymes and making up simple songs of our own.
- Exploring how to mix and change colours.
- Using instruments and body percussion to copy and create simple rhythms.
- Using paint, chalk, felt pens, pencils and collage to create pictures and talk about what we have done.
- Using our role play areas to play with our friends and express our ideas about the world and things we experience.



### Religious Education (The Way, The Truth, The Life)

- Begin to understand the events that took place after Jesus rose from the dead at Easter.
- Learn that we are all part of God's family.
- Learn that a church is a special place.
