
If you have *patience*, you are able to not get annoyed, for example when something takes a long time, or when someone is not doing what you want them to do.

This month in school, we will be thinking about things we can do to help us stay patient...



- * Force yourself to slow down. Make yourself speak and move more slowly. It will appear to others as if you're calm and, by "acting" patient, you can often "feel" more patient.
- * Put it into perspective (is it really important you have/do it now?)
- * Use Empathy to work out how the other person feels.
- * Do something else (distract yourself).
- * Remember, you have a choice in how you react in every situation. You can choose to be patient, or choose not to be: it's all up to you.

This week in assembly we thought about how hard it is stay 'patient' at times. This half term in school, we will start our Christmas preparations. We get

very excited as we think about Christmas and this can be a time when it is very difficult to stay patient! We discussed why it is important to stay patient and what we can do to help us.
