

Keeping Safe in School......We have also focused this week on how we


'stay safe' in school. We shared the story of 'Snore, Gobble and Shiver' in assembly and thought about the importance of rules and why we need them.

Rules like 'No running in school', 'No swinging on your chair', 'No smoking on school premises' and 'No dogs

allowed on school grounds' keep us safe and protect us.

We also discussed how we have protective measures in school to help keep us safe, for example, we make visitors report to Reception so no one can come into school unless they have signed

in and we know who they are. They are then given a visitors badge to wear.



The children show great understanding of how we 'Keep Safe in School'. They recognised that on our computers and laptops we have filters, which mean they cannot access things we deem

unsuitable for their age.

We discussed how many staff are First Aid trained which means if the children hurt themselves in class or at playtime someone will help them.

They also recognised that all staff are always there to help them if they have any worries or fears and

this helps keep them safe too.
