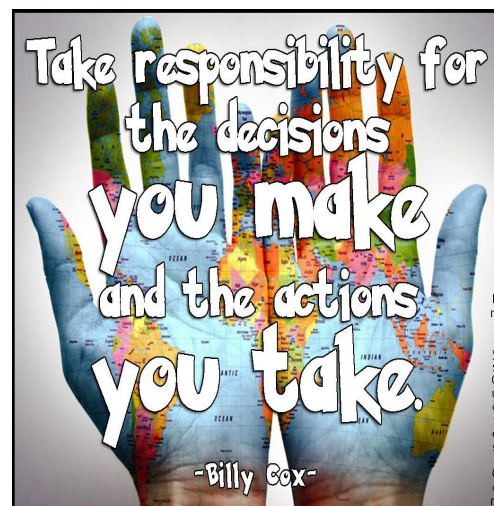

- Being trusted by others

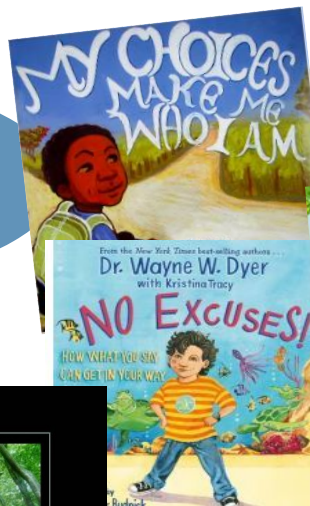
Thank you to Year 3 for the wonderful display to celebrate our new value.
